The San Diego Foundation Civic Leadership Activities:

Environment Program

The Environment program preserves and protects San Diego's stunning, natural assets resulting in grants that saved more than 28,000 acres of natural lands. The Foundation has also partnered with 18 cities, the County, the Port District, and the County Water Authority to take action on climate change.

Balboa Park Conservancy

The San Diego Foundation in conjunction with the Legler Benbough and the Parker Foundation conducted critical research to plan the future of Balboa Park which laid the groundwork for the development of the Balboa Park Conservancy.

Fire Pit Preservation

With city budget cuts, The San Diego Foundation in conjunction with our affiliate, the La Jolla Community Foundation, spearheaded countywide civic engagement and support to preserve the fire pits on the beaches and bays of San Diego.

San Diego Regional Disaster Fund

The San Diego Regional Disaster Fund, a supporting organization of The San Diego Foundation, facilitated long-term rebuilding and recovery of our community after the devastating fires in 2007.
